



## Public Information Plan of the Constitutional Commission of the Republic of Kosovo

### *Statistics resulting from the public comment:*

The Constitutional Commission of the Republic of Kosovo has reviewed all comments submitted by citizens and various local and international organizations.

The overall percentage of public comments that have been fully or partially incorporated in the approved Constitution is approximately 36 %.

Of the 64% of the submitted comments that were not incorporated into the Constitution most were due to noncompliance with the Kosovo Declaration of Independence or the provisions of the Comprehensive Proposal for the Kosovo Status Settlement.

As a result of the public comment, the following 77 articles of the Constitution have been modified or added by the Constitutional Commission: *(article numbers below are listed as per the final version of the Constitution)*
